

Bamboo and Kudzu

Bamboo and Kudzu are two very invasive and aggressive vegetation. Their eradication takes a lengthy time to complete for success or it prove impossible to control.



Bamboo...

- Pruning proves most difficult to do and doesn't provide any measure of control
- Can be eradicated if the area is small and concentrated and is not growing into or out of woods
- Steps for Control:
 - 1. Terex or Fecon mulching to shred the target site
 - 2. Rhizome Barrier installation (24" to 30" depth) at edge of maintenance zone
 - 3. Granular application of dichlobenil to stop the rhizomes from growing (Fall application)
 - 4. Liquid application of Glyphosate to any sprigs that resurface
- It takes approximately 3 years to control the bamboo in the right-of-way zone
- In yards Member agrees to spray and mow any bamboo resurfacing within the maintenance zone
- In wooded and unmaintained sites, we simply check every year to ensure control

Kudzu..

- Can be eradicated if the area is small and concentrated and is not growing into or out of woods
- For ineradicable sites we simply mow down and cut what we can and spray with Transline or another effective herbicide or mix
- Kudzu normally comes back
